Educate Together welcomes €284,000 ethical education grant from EU

Educate Together has been awarded a €284,000 EU grant to encourage the development of ethical education.

The grant, obtained through a European grant scheme (Erasmus+), will help fund a project called 'Learn Together to Live Together - Teachers leading Ethical Education for an inclusive society (LITTLE).

The funds are ring-fenced for this project and will be conducted by Educate Together's Education and Support Programme.



The project also involves three European partners, Univerza Liublan, Slovenia; Petit Philosophy, Croatia and STEPS, Italy.

It will run over three years and includes the design of a high-quality online interactive course for teachers as well as the development of good practice guides for teachers in Ethical Education.

"Educate Together is thrilled to have been awarded this grant. It will help us broaden our supports to teachers in our schools through developing high quality courses and guides for teachers of Ethical Education", said Sandra Irwin-Gowran, education & support programme manager with Educate Together.


